On behalf of the American Society of Anesthesiologists® (ASA) and our 52,000 members, I am writing to express our support for H.R. 5761, the Ending Maternal Mortality Act and to applaud your leadership on this important issue.

H.R. 5761 recognizes the importance of decreasing America's maternal mortality rate as a method of increasing the overall health and well-being in our nation. Specifically, your bill would require the Department of Health and Human Services to design and implement an aggressive National Strategy to Combat Maternal Mortality, with the goal of cutting the rate of preventable maternal deaths by half in the next decade. This renewed commitment to maternal health is important because roughly 60% of today's maternal deaths are considered preventable. We are confident that the research and public education encouraged in this bill will have a significant impact on maternal mortality. Your legislation is consistent with our commitment to improving patient care.
