# ACGME Review Committee (RRC) for Anesthesiology Criteria and Duties for Nominations 2016-2018 Term

#### **Qualifications of the Resident Member**

The resident members must be enrolled in an ACGME-accredited anesthesiology residency program at the time of appointment, and may not serve more than one year beyond completion of residency or fellowship. The resident term is two years. Resident members may not serve on two Review Committees simultaneously and must not be from the same state or institution as other members of the Review Committee. Resident members must have passed the Basic Examination offered by the American Board of Anesthesiology. At the time of the next Resident Member's appointment (July 2016), these states and institutions will include:

- University of California, San Francisco- San Francisco, CA
- Stanford University Stanford, CA
- University of Florida, Gainesville, FL
- Northwestern University Feinberg School of Medicine Chicago, IL
- Massachusetts General Hospital Boston, MA
- Cleveland Clinic Cleveland, OH
- Hospital of the University of Pennsylvania Philadelphia, PA

# Responsibilities of the RRC Resident Member

The Resident Member participates as a full voting member in all RRC activities, including program review and policy discussion. The Resident Member is subject to the same confidentiality, conflict of interest, duality of interest, and fiduciary responsibility policies of the other members.

The Resident Member is also a member of the ACGME Council of Review Committee Residents (CRCR). The CRCR is composed of the Resident Members of each Review Committee. It is a very important Council for the ACGME because it provides valuable input and feedback to the ACGME Board about matters related to residents, graduate medical education, and accreditation. The CRCR meets twice a year; dates are listed below.

Note: It is the Program Director's responsibility to ensure that the Resident Member will have sufficient time to review programs, attend RRC and CRCR meetings, and participate in activities of the RRC and the ACGME as expected. While this nomination is for a term that begins July 1, 2016, please know that the resident will start orientation/observation activities 6 months prior to the official start date to include a formal orientation meeting and one meeting as an observer.

## Selection of Next Resident Member

The American Society of Anesthesiologists must submit at least two nominees for the opening. The RRC will review nominations in August and will forward the selection for the next Resident Member to the ACGME Board of Directors for approval at the September ACGME meeting.

### **To Submit Nominations**

Please submit all of the following required documents for each nominated resident:

- A personal statement from the resident
- An up-to-date CV from the resident
- A letter of support from the resident's program director that confirms the resident will have sufficient time to review programs, attend RRC and CRCR meetings, and participate in activities of the RRC and the ACGME as expected.

### **Additional Information**

Orientation will be managed through a teleconference in the spring, followed by participation in the RRC's May/June 2016 meeting as an observer. Review Committee meetings are usually two-day meetings. The RRC will meet face-to-face 2 times per year, usually in February and May/June. The Resident Council meets twice a year, in January and September. An additional teleconference may be held in the fall. RRC members are required to attend all meetings and teleconferences. Nominees must be skilled in the use of computers. Review Committee members must use electronic systems for reimbursement of expenses and accreditation.

Meeting locations vary, however the spring meetings are generally held in Chicago. All related travel and meeting expenses are covered by the ACGME. More information about the ACGME can be found at acgme.org
